Evaluation of Christian responses to ethical issues: human and animal life and death, theft, lying, marriage, sexuality, genetic engineering, wealth, tolerance, and freedom of religious expression. Exploration of Christian views on free will, moral responsibility, and conscience in ethical decision-making.
