This year there are 188 school days, leaving 177 non-school days for family holidays, shopping trips, non-urgent medical appointments!

90% attendance means your child is missing half a day EVERY week, which means they will miss approximately 95 hours of learning in a school year!

Did you KNOW?

Students can attend school, even if feeling poorly; with parent's permission we can provide paracetamol should a student need it.

If your daughter arrives at school after 9:15am, after registers close it is coded as 'U' and counts as an unauthorised absence in terms of attendance figures. If a pupil is persistently late after the official close of the register, this can result in EWO involvement, and a penalty notice

Recent research by the Department for Education shows just how closely <u>attendance</u> and attainment are linked. Students with 90% attendance or less in secondary school could earn £10,000 less at age 28 compared to pupils with near-perfect attendance.

15 minutes late to school every day equates to 50 hours of lost learning each school year.

If your child is absent for 5 days in any 10 consecutive 10 school weeks, it can result in a fine of £160 per parent, per child, if paid within 28 days; this will be reduced to £80 per parent per child, if paid within 21 days.
