As a small Sixth Form, we support our students to ensure all our students are successful during their time with us. We are very proud of our impressive track record of success in educating and equipping our students to fulfil their dreams and aspirations whatever their desired direction in life.



As a girls only Sixth Form we offer an environment where you can develop into your best self. Our Sixth Form community is comprised of girls of many different backgrounds and faiths connected by our FCJ values.

We believe that the following ingredients enable our Sixth Form students to be so successful:

Personalised Support

Our Sixth Form Pastoral support is outstanding. We provide one to one help with UCAS applications. Each student has a form tutor who supports them during their two years in our Sixth Form. All our form tutors provide advice to our students around their next steps and take particular interest in the progress of every student. We also have an excellent PSHE programme of study, which we feel is essential to the education of the whole person. Our careers advice is timely and personalised.

Our Class Sizes are small

On average we have between ten and twelve students in every Sixth Form class. This allows our staff to give the maximum amount of personalised support and to provide all students with the platform to achieve their academic potential.

Caring Environment

We know our students as individuals and treat them accordingly. The staff are always available to offer subject support to ensure that any gaps in knowledge are dealt with quickly. This dedication to our students in supporting their progress sets us apart from other colleges. We know the strengths and weaknesses of our students and work with them to achieve their goals.

We provide individual mentoring to students to support their academic progress and emotional well-being.

Sixth Form Only Facilities

Reasons To Choose A Girls' Sixth Form

There is a body of research which suggests that girls do learn differently from boys. Young women have a greater confidence and freedom in questioning and in expressing themselves. The experience young women have in girls' only settings develops courage and the experience to face the challenges ahead with confidence. This is the 'can-do' generation, and our single sex environment allows us to provide an education in which your daughter's leadership and other strengths will blossom.

She will benefit from a focussed educational and community environment.

When a school does not have to accommodate both sexes, it simplifies the running and organisation of the school. The only focus is girls and their needs and activities.

Fewer distractions

The inherent distractions that occur when you mix boys and girls together in a mixed Sixth Form just do not happen in a girls' Sixth Form. The social expectations and stereotypes can be broken down. Fewer distractions mean a girl can focus on being herself, finding out who she is, exploring new worlds, lines of thinking and so much more. She can think outside the box with relative impunity. And that is a good thing.

"Girls' schools help girls to find their voices and to learn how to use them at a young age. At girls' schools, students are encouraged and expected to speak their minds, without interruption. A recent national survey found that nearly 87% of girls' school students feel they are <u>able</u> to share their voices and their opinions are respected, compared to 58% of girls at coed schools."

We encourage our girls to take opportunities to shine both in and outside the classroom and celebrate their successes. We create a unique and special environment where girls are provided with opportunities to step outside their comfort zone and take risks. Each girl is encouraged to find her passion and plan for her future. This provides purpose and a positive attitude that will build self-belief and self-worth. Girls have the space in which their intellect, physicality, and confidence can grow. Our girls have the freedom to be who they want to be in our Sixth Form and have the confidence to choose whatever educational opportunities they wish to.





Academic Achievement

Girls who attend Girls' School Association girls' schools tend to achieve a disproportionately large share of the top grades. For example, in 2019, the proportion of top A-star-A grades at A level achieved by GSA students (53.1%) was more than twice the national average (25.2%) for England.



Our **Foundation Programme** is a 12 month study pathway that includes English, Maths, a Business Level 2 qualification, an ICT Level 2 qualification, the Certificate of Personal Effectiveness Level 2 qualification and Work Experience

The Level 2 Certificate of Personal Effectiveness (CoPE) is a substantial and wideranging qualification, the purpose of which is to enable students to develop and demonstrate a range of personal, key and employability skills, to broaden their experience and manage their learning in a variety of real life contexts.

At the end of the Foundation Programme it is expected that students will either progress to a Level 3 programme of study, find an Apprenticeship or secure permanent employment.

The Girls Network

Each student is matched to a mentor who will support them through their A Levels and give them a number of professional opportunities along the way.

Enrichment

What is Enrichment?

Sixth Form Enrichment is a compulsory course for all Sixth Formers at Bellerive. It is designed to go beyond the realms of the examined curriculum to stimulate students' interests, in both an academic and practical sense.

Why do we do it?

We believe that it is vital we help students develop into well-rounded, socially and morally responsible young adults, who are comfortable taking on leadership responsibilities.

When will we do it?

Every Monday morning is dedicated to Enrichment Activities and students will work in groups. All groups will have a **half termly focus** and an outcome to be achieved at the end of each half term. Enrichment groups will take place every Monday morning P1 and P2.

All activities will give students the opportunity to work as a team, problem solve, practise research skills, practise public speaking and work with the public or lower year groups.

Level 3 Core Maths

This qualification will earn you 20 UCAS points. It is to aid students studying A Levels with some numeric content and to keep their mathematical knowledge up to date.

Career Investigators

Students will investigate growth areas based on labour market information pertaining to the Merseyside area.

Students will use Monday morning to plan and prepare coaching sessions for PE extra-curricular clubs. Students will deliver the sessions in a lunch time club.

PE Technicians

Work during enrichment time in the PE Department as directed by PE Staff.

EAL Support Students

Work with our HLTA supporting lower school students who have English as an additional language.

Sixth Form Newsletter

Students will create a half termly newsletter, celebrating success stories, promoting charities, sharing information, interview staff, promote university courses etc...

Charity Champions

Students will work as a team and research different



charities. Students will choose a charity they wish to support and present the idea in sixth form assembly/form notices. Plan fund raising events.

Reading Champions

Work in the library with students in Yr7/8 who require additional support. Listen to KS3 students read.

DT Teaching Assistant

Duties will involve helping students who need one to one support and organising practical resources.

Languages Teaching Assistant/Languages Club

Students will support in KS3 Language lessons. They will also use the time to prepare for extra-curricular languages club.

Student Mentor

Complete a three-week student mentor course. Meet with and support lower school students in a mentoring role.

Assembly Leaders

Students will choose a topic, research it and then plan and deliver an assembly to a year group.
