The trust was launched formally in October and marks an exciting moment in the development of religious order schools in the UK. The Gaudete Trust is a collaborative trust exercising the educational trusteeship of five Religious Orders, namely: The Christian Brothers (CFC) Sisters of Charity of St Paul the Apostle (SP) De La Mennais Brothers FICP (Brothers of Christian Instruction) The Faithful Companions of Jesus (FCJ) The Congregation of La Sainte Union (LSU) The mainspring of the Trust is the desire of Religious Orders to continue to put their charisms at the service of the Church. By adopting a collaborative approach to trusteeship, the Gaudete Trust offers those Religious Orders an alternative way of continuing to serve Catholic education.
